

Essay Contest with \$1000 Prize Announced by Society of Albert the Great



Manchester, New Hampshire, January 10, 2013 - The Society of Albert the Great announces a new essay contest for teenagers. The writer of the winning essay will receive a prize of \$1000 in scholarship assistance from the Society of Albert the Great.

The essay question is:

*The history of our world includes institutions of many kinds: the family, the United States Senate, the Round Table. In the twenty-first century what world institution **most** needs to be renewed? What **means** should be used to renew it, and what **benefits** would arise from its renewal? Be as specific as possible in your proposal.*

Essays will be accepted from persons age fifteen to nineteen as of January 2, 2012. Essays should be at least 100 and no longer than 1000 words. Your essay must be entirely the contestant's own work and should be postmarked no later than March 1, 2013. Please keep a copy of your essay because the Society cannot return any submissions.

The winning essay will receive a prize of \$1000 for educational assistance. Contestants must agree in advance to allow The Society of Albert the Great to republish their essay in its materials, although contestants will retain the copyright and the Society will acknowledge their authorship whenever used. The winner will be announced by May 1, 2013. The decision of our judges is final. Anyone meeting the age criterion is eligible to enter an essay, but the prize award winner must meet the Society's Conflict of Interest policy.
